

Computing

Computing Systems and Networks 1: What is a computer? Exploring what a computer is by identifying and learning how inputs and outputs work. Understanding how computers are used in the wider world, children design their own computerised invention.



History

How have significant people shaped our world?

Key people: Florance Nightingale, Mary Anning, Frida Kahlo

Children will use information given to describe events and people beyond living memory. They will explore reasons why a significant person in the past may have made decisions in order to bring about change.



Music

Hands, Feet, Heart: is a song written for children to celebrate and learn about South African Music. Children will learn to sing, play and improvise to this song whilst learning about dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.).

Ho Ho Ho: Children will continue to embed the interrelated dimensions of music through games, singing and playing with this Christmas sone.



Geography

Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?

Introduction to climate zones and mapping out hot and cold places globally. Looking at features in the North and South Poles and Kenya. Comparing weather and features in the local area. Learning compass points. Learning the names and locating the continents of our world.



PSHE

Being Me in My World: Children discuss hopes and fears for the year ahead, learn about rights and responsibilities, how to work collaboratively and make their classroom safe. They learn about choices and consequences.

Celebrating Difference: Children learn about gender stereotypes. They explore how children can be bullied because they are different and how they can support them. Children share feelings associated with bullying and friendship.



Science

Animals including Humans – In this unit, children will learn how to notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults. They find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air) and finally they learn how to describe the importance of exercise, eating the right amounts of food and hygiene.

Who do Christians believe made the world?

Children will explore the Christian (and Jewish) story of Creation, understanding that it is the beginning of the 'big story' of the Bible. Children will then look at examples of what Christians do to say thank you to God for the Creation which includes Harvest Festival celebrations and how Christians believe they should look after God's creation.

Who is Jewish and how do they live?

Children will investigate important prayers and stories used for Jewish worship and celebrations. They will look in detail at Shabbat and Chanukah and how these celebrations help Jewish people to reflect upon their lives.

Home Learning

Reading:

Throughout the school, we emphasise developing a love of reading and books. From Reception to Year 6, reading should take place daily. Regular daily reading at home is so very important to help your child in becoming a fluent reader. We encourage parents to read and discuss literature with their children and believe that reading should be a shared experience where possible. Throughout the school, we emphasise developing a love of reading and books. From Reception to Year 6, reading should take place daily. Regular daily reading at home is so very important to help your child in becoming a fluent reader. We encourage parents to read and discuss literature with their children and believe that reading should be a shared experience where possible.



Each child has a home reading record that is included within their reading packet. This record has key information about Phonics along with grapheme charts and tricky words. Each week, the children will be sent home with Phonics learning, in addition to regular reading. All Early Reading advice states that when teaching children to read, they encounter a wealth of texts that are almost fully decodable (only a few common exception/tricky words). To ensure that we are in line with Trust and Local Authority guidelines, we will no longer be issuing book banded books to children to take home. Instead, they will bring home a library book and a decodable mini book. In time, your child will be granted access to an electronic copy of a Rhino Reader book that they have been using in Guided Reading sessions. More information to follow...



Home Learning

Maths Fluency: Learning times tables is really important. After all, they're the building blocks of maths, and with their multiplications mastered, they can do anything! Therefore, each child from Year 2 - Year 6 has a log in for 'Times Tables Rock Stars' (TTRS). This is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practise online which helps your child learn their tables in a fun and engaging way. We are at the very start of our Times Tables journey so at present, the children do not access this. However, we will be starting this over the next few weeks. From then on, please encourage your child to log on to TTRS as often as possible. Children's use of these apps are monitored closely by teachers. Each week, one child per class is awarded the TTRS Champion. Until that time, please continue to use Numbots to help your child secure their understanding of addition and subtraction.
