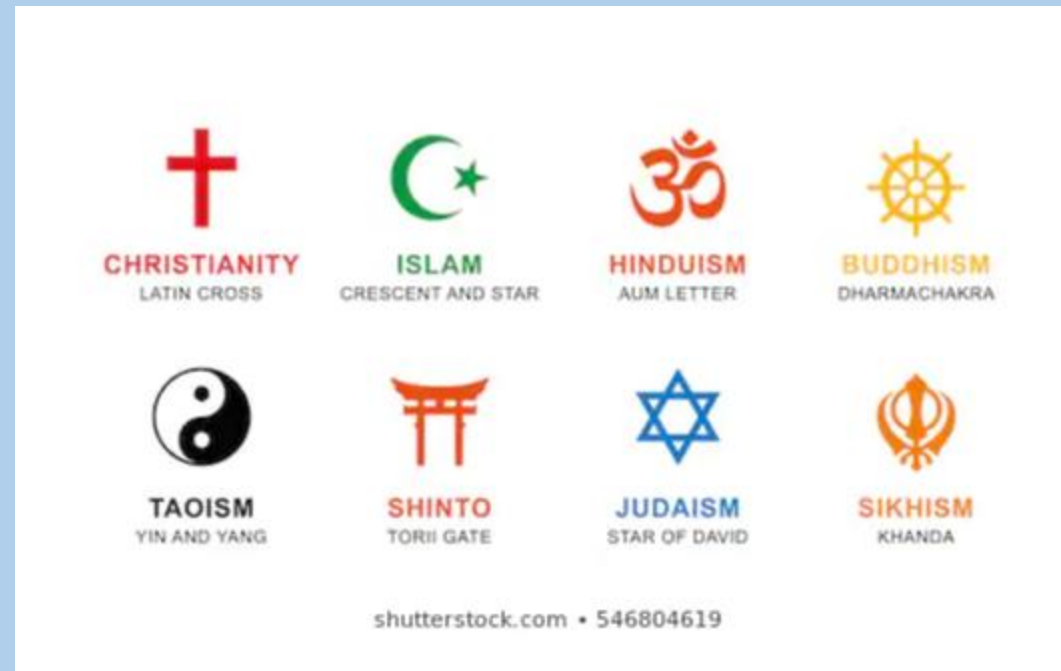

# What Is the first pillar?



## The Shahadah

The belief that there is no God but Allah and that Muhammad is his messenger.

Shahadah is the first and arguably the most important pillar.

It is a declaration of faith.

Anyone who wishes to be a Muslim must say and believe in the Shahadah.

Muslims repeat the Shahadah everyday in their prayers.

The Shahadah reminds Muslims that there is only one god (Allah).



**There is no god but Allah and Muhammad  
(PBUH) is his messenger.**

The Shahadah is usually said a 5 times each day. It is said at birth as the first words a baby hears, and Muslims aim for these to be the last words they say before death.

# What is the Qur'an?

The Qur'an is the Islamic Holy book.

Muslims believe it is the direct word of Allah. Allah is the Arabic word for God.

The word of God was revealed to the prophet Muhammed (pbuh) through the angel Jibril (Gabriel).

## What Does the Qur'an Do?

The Qur'an teaches Muslims how to worship God.

It teaches Muslims how to live good lives.

It teaches Muslims how to treat other people.

### The Prophet Muhammad's revelation

#### The Night of Power (Laylat al-Qadr)

Muhammad spent a lot of his time in prayer and meditation. On one of these occasions, he received the first revelation of the Qur'an from Allah. Muslims know this as the **Night of Power**.

- Muhammad was meditating in a cave on Mount Hira when he saw the Angel Jibril.
- The angel commanded him to recite the words before him.
- Muhammad had never been taught to read or write but he was able to recite the words.
- In this way, Allah's message continued to be revealed to Muhammad over the next 23 years.
- Muhammad then recited the message to his people.
- After Muhammad's death, the Qur'an was compiled under the instruction of Abu Bakr, the successor of Muhammad.

The Prophet Muhammad was a kind and honest man. He taught people the Qur'an and that there is only one god Allah.

The Prophet Muhammad inspired many people.

Muslims use the stories to guide their beliefs and actions when caring for others and the word.



### The Qur'an

The Qur'an teaches Muslims how to live a good life.

Here are just a few rules which Muslims must live by:

- Worship only one God
- Pray 5 times a day
- Give to charity
- Show respect and love to your parents
- Show forgiveness to others



# What difference does worshipping God make to Muslims?

Ask your child:

What do you think is most important to Muslims (there is not always one correct answer, of course):

- Reading the Holy Qur'an / Watching TV
- Hearing stories of the Prophet / hearing the call to prayer
- Saying: 'Peace be upon him' / saying 'thank you'
- Being kind to animals / praying to God
- Sharing your money / praying to Allah
- Going on pilgrimage / going to school.

Ask you child to explain why they think their choice is the most important.
